HCE FACEBOOK

Facebook is what people call a social media platform. It is a way to communicate with friends or make new friends. I have made a page for our Columbia County HCE. You can find it if you go to a search box on the top of a Facebook account: Home & Community Education - HCE Columbia County WI. Technically the address is: <https://www.facebook.com/columbia.uwex.edu>.

If you don't have a Facebook account, it is easy to sign up for one. You will need to enter your name, your e-mail address, and you will need to make a password. In making passwords, it is best to not use words like "password." You can use random numbers and letters – just write them down so you can remember them. You will be asked who can see your posts: public, friends, friends except, specific friends, or only me (which means just you). You will be asked who can send you friend requests: everyone or friends of friends.

As an active pastor, I had youth connected to my site, so I set my security pretty high. It did mean I sometimes had to lower it if someone I know wants to be my friend but we don't have mutual friends. DO NOT ACCEPT FRIEND requests from people you don't know. You can post a photo of yourself or of flowers. After you get on, don't get caught in scams. People will hack an account and ask you to 'FRIEND' them again. There are people that will make bad comments. Don't feel bad about not ask-

ing people you don't know to be friends. Don't feel bad about "unfriending" someone. You can block people that are really bad. Don't take it personally if it happens to you.

When you have an account of your own, you can connect to our group account. Up on the top bar you will find your name, a "call out" with a squiggle which is for Messenger (like sending e-mail) and a world. When you 'friend' a page or person you can decide if you will get notifications – the world will have numbers by it and a menu to see the notifications you have requested. Pages don't always show up in notifications. You may have to look over on the far left column for Short Cuts and click on our page.

NO recipes can be posted. Only photos of people with photo releases in the county office can have photos on the page. If your club goes to a nursing home, bring photo releases so the residents can have their photo taken. Or, just take a picture of your group. You can post what you are doing. "Advertise" your club meeting and what special things you are doing. This is really your page that I am managing. Make it yours. Make it what you want it to be. Share it and use it.
