



Expo — cont.

Objectives:

- 1. To provide youth with an experience in planning, preparing and displaying an article or educational exhibit
- 2. To give youth an opportunity for self-expression verbally and visually in a safe and supportive environment.
- 3. To provide youth with an opportunity to share with others what they have learned during the discovery process while creating their Expo exhibit
- 4. To develop public presentation ability

Summary:

Unlike traditional science fairs which feature experiment after experiment; Inquiry, Innovation and Creativity Expo participants are encouraged to find something that interests them within their 4-H project areas and explore it using their 21st Century Skills like critical thinking, creativity, communication, and collaboration. By selecting a topic within a 4-H project area of interest, participates are able to take their Expo exhibit, one step further, to the County Fair.

Whether it's analyzing the different foods that are available to dairy cows, conducting an experiment, or creating an innovation that fulfills a need in their lives, the focus of the project is completely up to the participant.

Sharing your Story:

This is not a judged event, however, each participant will be asked to set up their display and provide a short presentation about the discovery process used in designing and creating their project. Sample talking points that may be helpful in crafting your short presentation are listed below:

- What 4-H project area(s) does your exhibit most relate to?
- What do you already know about this project area?
- Why did you choose to focus on this project?
- What question(s) are you trying to answer? Did you answer your question(s)?
- What do you want to learn, try and/or discover about this project now?
- Who/What can help you learn more about your project?
- What resources did you use to help create your project (i.e. people, books, businesses)?
- What was the most interesting thing you discovered while creating your exhibit?
- Would you do anything differently if you recreated your project?
- What were your steps?

Milk Moola from Kwik Trip

YQCA Replaces PQA & MAQA—What does that mean to YOU?

YQCA or Youth for the Quality Care of Animals was developed and funded by national livestock industry professionals, extension specialists, and livestock show managers. It replaces the National Pork Board's Youth Pork Quality Assurance (PQA) program and Wisconsin's Meat Animal Quality Assurance (MAQA) program. Previously, youth, who exhibited and then sold swine, were required to enroll in a PQA or an MAQA class. Now, those same swine project members will need to enroll in an YQCA class, either online or face-to-face. In addition, all Wisconsin State Fair exhibitors of food animals (beef, dairy, goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep and swine) MUST complete an YQCA class and become YQCA certified.

YQCA Course content includes an age appropriate module from each of the following program areas: Animal Welfare; Food Safety; and Character Education. Certification is offered in two formats to meet varied learning styles and active schedules. The YQCA website is found at www.yaca.org. Once at the website. look to the upper right hand corner for - Sign In/Register. Next, follow instructions to create an account and then to the "online" option or the "face-to-face/trainer led" option.

Online - Fee: \$12/exhibitor/year Available 24/7 - OR - Face-to-Face/Trainer-Led - Fee: \$3/exhibitor/year

Both certification types (Online and Face-to-Face) must be paid online with a credit card. The nominal course fees (\$12/\$3) ensures the course content/learning platform stays current.

The Columbia County UW Extension Office will be offering an YQCA face-to-face meeting on March 15, 2018, just prior to the 4-H Livestock Committee meeting, 6 p.m., in the Administration Building, Portage. A nominal fee may be charged at the door to help cover material costs. This fee will be in addition to the fee charged when an individual registers at the YQCA website www.yqca.org. 10th Anniversary of the U.S. Targhee Sheep Association Starter Flock Three Free Registered Targhee Sheep to be Awarded to Deserving Youth

The U.S. Targhee Sheep Association (USTSA) will be celebrating the 10th anniversary of its Starter Flock Program by again offering a free registered Targhee Starter flock to a deserving youth at the 2018 USTSA National Show & Sale in Miles City, Montana, July 12th-14th. The winner must be present to receive the flock and will be awarded one (1) ewe lamb, one (1) yearling ewe, and one (1) brood ewe donated by members of the USTSA. Each animal will be a USTSA registered animal, and at least QR in Scrapie Codon 171 genotype. The winner will also receive a \$150 credit for use toward purchase of additional animals at the 2018 sale.

Applications, due **April 1st**, are now available to download at www.ustargheesheep.org or by contacting Mardy Rutledge at the USTSA office (ustargheesheep@gmail.com or 702-292-5715). Any young person, ages 9-17, as of January 1, 2018, whose family does not raise Targhee sheep may apply. Applicants should possess a keen interest in the U.S. sheep industry, commitment to raising Targhee sheep over time, and a firm belief in the abilities of the breed. Applicants must demonstrate proof of care, facilities, and transportation. Aside from receiving the flock of sheep, the winning youth, will be paired with a Targhee breeder living near them who will act as a mentor. The association is committed to helping the winner succeed.

Targhee sheep are one of the few breeds developed in the United States at the U.S. Sheep Experiment Station in Dubois, Idaho. Withstanding harsh environments and minimal human intervention, while still producing high quality lamb and wool are hallmark traits of Targhees. Mothering ability and gentle dispositions are additional positive traits of the breed.

The U.S. Targhee Sheep Association believes in the future. The success the program has had thus far has only affirmed it is the right thing to do for young people. In the past 9 years, the generous members of the USTSA have awarded 13 flocks, totaling over 40 head of sheep! Please pass the word along to a young person you know. 

It is time to start thinking about and planning to participate in our 2018 WI 4-H ArtBEAT!

4-H ArtBEAT! was created for 4-H members in grades 3-5 and their parents and leaders and is the introductory program for Wisconsin 4-H Arts and Communication! ArtBEAT! will be held **March 16 and 17, 2018**, at our State 4-H Camp, Upham Woods in the Wisconsin Dells. Camp begins Friday evening at 7 pm and ends Saturday afternoon at 3 pm.

The weekend will feature a look at a variety of arts projects including music, drama, visual arts, and more! 4-H members will explore their own creativity while discovering the great variety of 4-H Arts & Communication experiences available to them now and in the near future. Session leaders will be 4-H older youth, adult leaders and 4-H staff members with a wealth of experience to share. Youth and adult participants will rotate through a variety of sessions, which are hands-on and active and held at various sites throughout camp. Both youth and adult participants stay in the warm and cozy heated cabins! Parents are not required to attend the camp. All adults attending the camp will be considered adult advisors (chaperones) and will be responsible for providing leadership and support for ALL campers not just their own child. As such, all adults who want to attend the camp must complete the requirements to become an active 4-H volunteer before camp. Interested adults who are not already active 4-H volunteers should contact their county UW-Extension 4-H office as soon as possible for assistance in completing the process to become a volunteer. The process involves training and a background check.

The \$50.00 per person fee (youth and adults) will include all materials and supplies (including a very cool ArtBEAT! backpack), overnight lodging and breakfast and lunch on Saturday. Why not get a whole carload of youth and adults together from your county for some genuine 4-H FUN? Transportation to the camp is NOT provided by the State 4-H Office.

4-H Shooting Sports Certification Workshops

In order to be a WI 4-H Shooting Sports Leader, you must be certified in the discipline that you are teaching (archery, coordinator, muzzleloader, pistol, rifle and/or shotgun). Leaders may only teach in the discipline in which they are certified. An adult leader cannot provide hands-on or safety instruction without a certified leader supervising the range.

All leaders must complete one 12-hour workshop to be certified. After that, you may be eligible to attend a Saturday, eight-hour range workshop to receive an additional discipline certification. If three years lapse before adding an additional certification, the full 12-hour certification must be repeated. Only one certification may be obtained at any one certification workshop.







QUILTING -- Pinwheel 7 Runner Workshop Pattern adapted from www.quilterscache.com, Presented by Patti James







Workshop includes:

Making and assembling 3 quilt blocks to create a table runner for your table or dresser with the Pinwheel block. This block can be used in a larger project and create a lap quilt or larger. It is made entirely of half-square triangles.

A variety of methods to use in creating a half-square triangle block will be demonstrated, as well as designs for quilt blocks utilizing the half-square triangle block in a variety of layouts.

Participants need to have at least one year in the quilting project and knowledge of rotary cutting methods.

Fabric supplies needed to create 3 blocks for the runner:

Note: Good quality fabric makes quilting much easier. Here is a list of some local stores where good quality fabric and help in selection of colors that coordinate with your home are available. In Portage: The Welcome Home Sew n Vac; Endeavor: Homespun Fabrics; Lodi: Village Creek; Madison: Quintessential Quilts; Beaver Dam: Nancy's Notions

Fabrics Needed (please bring with you to Project Spotlight)

½ yd. light colored 100% cotton fabric (a tone on tone light colored fabric or plain white or cream)

½ yard dark colored 100% fabric (choose a fabric without a lot of colors and big prints)

1/3 yd. of the dark 100% cotton fabric for binding

½ yd. coordinating 100% cotton fabric for the backing of the runner.

Batting: Will be provided in your fee.

Equipment:

Sewing machine in good working order with operating book and accessories (Machine must be able to stitch an accurate ¼" seam) with two bobbins wound with thread prior to class.



Sewing Kit - Seam ripper, scissors for trimming thread, pins, pin cushion, extra sewing machine needles (80/12), mechanical pencil or Friction pen to mark fabric

Rotary cutter and new blade installed, 24" rotary ruler, and small cutting mat, *optional12" rotary ruler

Thread- I use a shade of grey that blends with my darker fabric, or cream or light tan. I like Gutermann or Mettler thread brands.

I will bring larger cutting mats for your use for the workshop as well as irons and ironing boards.

Kumihimo Beaded Necklace - Instructor: Rita Briant of Prairie Flower Beads, Portage



Material cost is \$40.00. Instructor time is donated. Participants will create a necklace of beads and choose a matching pendant.

Photo is a sample only! Each participant will select his/her own color of beads and unique pendant!

Process:

- 1. 2 hours to string all the beads
- 2. 3 hours to braid the strings of beads together
- 3. Additional time to finish the ends
