Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Scholarships Applications due 3/15/19

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$10,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin students pursuing higher education in 2019. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by **Friday**, **March 15**, **2019**, **5**:00 pm.

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth, development and leadership, academic performance and future educational goals.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships, students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least one year; have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2019-2020 academic school year.

Selection Process

A panel of experienced youth advisors will screen the applications and select finalists. Applications chosen as finalists will be screened by a second panel comprised of 4-H and youth development experts. The finalist applications will be ranked. The 4-H Foundation will assign available scholarships to the top-ranking applications based on scholarship criteria (example: scholarships are available for specific geographical areas and project areas).

Notification

Applicants who are awarded scholarships will be notified by postal letter and/or email in May. This letter will include information about how to access the scholarship. Scholarship awardees are required to send a thank-you note to the scholarship sponsor. Scholarship recipients and portions of their application materials (including their photo) may be featured in Wisconsin 4-H Foundation materials.

4-H License Plates Look Great on YOUR Automobile!





Why not order a Wisconsin 4-H license plate for your car, truck or motor home this? The specialty plate, now available through the Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicles, supports the Wisconsin 4-H program, and bears the message 4-H Empowering Youth. The sale of the plate includes a fee that goes to the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation.

"This is a great way for our 4-H families, alumni and supporters to show their fierce love of 4-H," says Brenda Scheider, Executive Director for the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation. "Half of the proceeds from every plate sale will go back to the county in which the plate was purchased. The other half will be used for state and regional 4-H programs."

Vehicles that qualify for the 4-H license plate include:

- automobiles
- motor homes (annual registration only)
- motor trucks
- 4,500, 6,000 or 8,000 pounds gross weight including dual purpose farm and dual purpose motor home
- 12,000 pounds gross weight farm truck

Persons requesting 4-H Foundation license plates will pay:

- \$25 annual donation. The donation may be deductible.
- \$15 issuance fee or an annual \$15 personalized plate fee, if requested.

• The regular registration fee for the vehicle if the current plates expire within three months or the vehicle has no plates.

At each plate renewal, 4-H supporters will pay the \$25 donation and the regular registration fee for non-personalized 4-H license plates. 4-H license plates may be personalized by paying a \$15 personalized plate fee each year in addition to the \$25 donation and regular annual registration fee.

"Learn More" Challenge Award -- Livestock Educational Cards

Read on for DETAILS about the Columbia County "Learn More" Challenge Program and then get your livestock educational card completed. The Columbia County Livestock Committee developed the "Learn More" Challenge program to encourage youth to increase their knowledge of the species they exhibit. Youth accomplish this by taking advantage of the many great learning opportunities available to them and completing three or more educational events. As they do this, they complete an Educational Card for their animal species and collect signatures from the presenters. (Note: If youth participate in more than one species, they must complete three or more learning opportunities for each species.) Once the learning is complete, participants submit their educational cards and then have the chance to win special awards for participating. Awards are presented in the following categories: Beef, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Rabbits, and Avian/Poultry Remember: The more activities you attend, the more chances you have to win! 3 educational sessions = 1 chance 4 educational sessions = 2 chances 5 educational sessions = 3 chances And so on...... Educational cards are available online at https://columbia.uwex.edu/4-hyouth-development/4-h-projectinformation/animal-sciences/ or upon request from the Columbia County UW Extension Office. Completed educational cards are due each year on June 30th to the Livestock Committee (c/o Columbia County UW-Extension, Administration Building, Rm. 212, 112 E. Edgewater St., Portage, WI 53901.) Shortly after the deadline date, the livestock committee will draw for prizes and the awards are then presented each year on Sunday at the Columbia County Fair's Parade of Champions. Be sure to get started early by obtaining an Educational Card for the species of your animal(s) and then complete three or more of the listed sessions on the educational card throughout the program year, but prior to June 30th. (Note: Only 1 YQCA session per year is allowed.)

Foods Revue and Food Activity

Foods Revue is for you -- foods, food preservation, bread, Exploring and Cloverbud project members! Guidelines—What do you do?

- Foods Project Members: select a favorite food to prepare.
- Breads Project Members: select a favorite yeast bread to prepare.
- Foods Preservation Project Members: select a favorite preserved food to prepare.
- Foods, Breads, and Foods Preservation Members: plan a menu for your selected food item; plan a table covering, centerpiece, and table setting/service for the menu; and bring one serving of the selected food item.
- Cloverbuds and Exploring Project Members: select your favorite nutritious snack to prepare (no prepackaged foods / mixes); practice preparing it for yourself and for others; and select dishes, silverware to serve the snack, and a placemat or tablecloth. A centerpiece is optional.
- Setup may begin (a) 10:30 am, with judging to being at 11:00am.

4-H Food Activity

Food Activity is for you – foods, food preservation, and breads project members! Guidelines—What to do?

• Choose a foods-related activity or prepare a foods-related experiment or comparison that answers a question or questions.

- Complete the activity or experiment.
- Plan a display (similar to a science experiment display) to show the steps followed to answer the question/s. The display should contain the actual examples of your experiment.

Food Activity will follow Foods Revue.

Awards

All participants in Foods Revue and Food Activity will receive a gift certificate and / or door prize. The top "People's Choice" award winners will also be recognized.
