2019 Columbia County Fair Swine Project

Due to a new rule/law that became effective February 1, 2018, some changes to the swine project at the fair have been made. If the swine go to exhibition and the shows are not terminal, each pig must be tested for PRRS (Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome) and SECD (Swine Enteric Coronavirus Disease) within 90 days of the exhibition/show. A swine weigh-in is considered by the state veterinarian as an exhibition and all the pigs would need testing. Therefore, there will be no swine weigh-in held in April for the Columbia County Fair. The Columbia County Swine show remains non-terminal. Pigs will need to be tested within 90 days of the Columbia County Fair at the exhibitor's expense. Test results, test type, and the date of testing need to be included on the Wisconsin intrastate certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI or health certificate).

The identification process for swine at the Columbia County Fair is as follows: Please submit a picture of the swine project with one of the following tags in its ear:

- 1. Columbia County Tag
- 2. State Fair RFID Tag

The Columbia County swine ear tags may be picked up at the Columbia County Extension Office. The tags should be available by April 1st.

Along with the picture, please include the ear notch and tag number for more precise identification as well as whether the swine is barrow or gilt. Submissions can be emailed to: <u>Columbiacountyswine@yahoo.com</u>

As usual, only three pigs may be entered per exhibitor at the fair, but 10-15 pigs max. per family may be identified.

"Learn More" Challenge Award -- Livestock Educational Cards

Read on for DETAILS about the Columbia County "Learn More" Challenge Program and then get your livestock educational card completed. _The Columbia County Livestock Committee developed the "Learn More" Challenge program to encourage youth to increase their knowledge of the species they exhibit. Youth accomplish this by taking advantage of the many great learning opportunities available to them and completing three or more educational events. As they do this, they complete an Educational Card for their animal species and collect signatures from the presenters. (Note: If youth participate in more than one species, they must complete three or more learning opportunities for each species.) Once the learning is complete, participants submit their educational cards and then have the chance to win special awards for participating. Awards are presented in the following categories: Beef, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Rabbits, and Avian/Poultry Remember: The more activities you attend, the more chances you have to win! 3 educational sessions = 1 chance 4 educational sessions = 2 chances 5 educational sessions = 3 chances And so on..... Educational cards are available online at https://columbia.uwex.edu/4-h-youth-development/4-hprojectinformation/animal-sciences/ or upon request from the Columbia County UW Extension Office. Completed educational cards are due each year on June 30th to the Livestock Committee (c/o Columbia County UW-Extension, Administration Building, Rm. 212, 112 E. Edgewater St., Portage, WI 53901.) Shortly after the deadline date, the livestock committee will draw for prizes and the awards are then presented each year on Sunday at the Columbia County Fair's Parade of Champions. Be sure to get started early by obtaining an Educational Card for the species of your animal(s) and then complete three or more of the listed sessions on the educational card throughout the program year, but prior to June 30th. (Note: Only 1 YQCA session per year is allowed.)

The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who've demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied leadership skills, and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community. Selection of Key Award recipients should be based on an evaluation of the candidate's total 4-H record.

To be eligible, candidates must be in 9th grade or above and must have completed at least three years of 4-H and one year of youth leadership.

The quota of award recipients is determined by county 4-H enrollment of youth ages 14 years and older. Quotas are 2% of that population or a minimum of two per county.

The State 4-H Office will mail a framed certificate and pin. Key Award recipients are asked to send a note of appreciation to sponsors. Counties are encouraged to invite sponsor representatives to the presentation ceremony (Wisconsin Ag in the Classroom, Wisconsin Farm Bureau Federation, 800.261.FARM or aitc@wfbf.com).
