# Columbia County 4-H Leaders Council Votes to Support Campers

One more bit of news! At the January meeting the 4-H Leaders Council voted to support all campers at a rate of \$15 per day (sponsorship available on one camp per summer). So, if you attend the Green / Columbia County camp for four days (4 x \$15), you would receive a sponsorship of \$60 after you attend. Likewise, if you attended an Upham Woods Open Enrollment Camp for seven days (7 x \$15), you would receive a sponsorship of \$105

# **Columbia County Swine Identification Process**

All Swine must have a form of ID which includes an ear notch and Columbia County Fair ear tag.

Due to a new rule/law that became effective February 1, 2018, some changes to the swine project at the fair were made. If the swine go to exhibitions and the shows are not terminal, each pig MUST be tested for PRRS (Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome) and SECD (Swine Enteric Coronavirus Disease) within go days of the exhibition/show. A swine weigh-in is considered by the state veterinarian as an exhibition and all the pigs would need testing. Therefore, there will be NO swine weigh-in held in April for the Columbia County Fair. The Columbia County Fair swine show remains non-terminal. Pigs MUST be tested within 90 days of the show at the exhibitor's expense. Test results, test type and date of testing need to be included on the Wisconsin intrastate certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI or health certificate). This certificate MUST be presented prior to off-loading swine (a) the Fair.

The identification process for swine at the Columbia County Fair is as follows:

Please submit a picture of the swine project with one of the following tags in its ear:

- 1. Columbia County Tag
- 2. State Fair RFID Tag

The Columbia County Swine ear tags may be picked up at the Columbia County Extension Office. The tags should be available by the middle of March. 
# New 4-H Cloverbud Project Literature

# 4-H Shooting Sports Certification Workshops

A **Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports Leader** may be certified in archery, coordinator, muzzleloader, pistol, rifle and shotgun disciplines. Leaders may only teach in the discipline in which they are certified. An adult leader cannot provide hands-on or safety instruction without a certified leader supervising the range.

All leaders must first complete one 12-hour workshop to be certified. After that, you may be eligible to attend a Saturday, eight-hour range workshop to receive an additional discipline certification. If three years lapse before adding an additional certification, the full 12-hour certification must be repeated. Only one certification may be obtained at any one certification workshop.

The following are the WI shooting sports certification workshops planned for 2019:

(Must have 4 in each class to offer a discipline)

Workshop overview: All certification workshops are 6PM to 10PM on Friday and 8AM to 5:00PM Saturday. You must participate in all required hours to receive your certification. Those attending for the first time must complete the Friday and Saturday sessions. Those returning for an additional certification need only attend their Saturday range workshop providing three (3) years has not lapsed since attending the Friday session.



# Interpretive Reading of Prose

a Jungs

Participant selects written prose. Prose is ordinary language. It can include stories, play cuttings, narratives, or anything not written as a poem. The material is **read** with personal interpretation being presented; do not memorize it. Time Limit: Maximum 8 minutes.

# II. Interpretive Reading of Poetry

Participant selects poetry. It may be a single poem, a cutting from a single poem, or several related poems. Poetry is rhythmical. The composition is then **read** with personal interpretation being presented; do not memorize it. Time Limit: Maximum 8 minutes.

# III. Interpretive Reading of Original Prose or Poetry

Participant writes a poem or prose (story). The material is **read** with personal interpretation being presented; do not memorize it. Time Limit: Maximum 8 minutes.

# IV. Interpretive Team Reading

Participants select a prose, poetry or drama selection that would be suitable for two to five individuals. The grade category is determined by oldest member. Please list all grades on the registration form. This selection is not to be memorized. Props, costumes, and make-up are not to be used. This is not play acting, it is Interpretive Team <u>Reading</u>; do not act this out. Time Limit: Maximum 12 minutes.

# V. Memorized Declamation/Storytelling

Participant selects or writes prose or poetry. The material is then memorized and presented without notes in an interpretive fashion. If desired, props may be used for this category. Time Limit: Maximum 8 minutes.



# VI. Commercials

Participant prepares a 30, 60, or 90 second commercial for an original product (example: contact lenses for fish). Product props may be used, but any brand names must be covered. Prepare a convincing presentation, which includes a catchy introduction, reasons to buy the product, and a summary of what you want the audience to remember. **Commercial must be memorized**. Time Limit: Maximum 90 seconds.

- VII. Original Speech (Cloverbuds are NOT eligible to enter this category) Participant writes an original speech on any subject. Do not confuse with original prose. A speech is not a story, but one main idea that is developed and supported with facts. If an educational animal speech is given, it will count as an educational activity to exhibit at the 2015 WI State Fair in the species area the speech involves. Time Limit: Maximum 8 minutes.
- VIII. Original Project Activity (Cloverbuds are NOT eligible to enter this category) Participant prepares a project related experiment or comparison that answers three or more participant determined questions. The results are presented on an  $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" or larger card or display board. Display should include

examples. Participants present and explain their experiment and results to the audience. [Example: make two chocolate cakes, one with oil and one with applesauce instead of oil. Questions: # 1) which cake has better taste? #2) which cake has better texture? #3) which cake has better appearance? #4) which cake is better overall?] Time Limit: Maximum 5 minutes.

- IX. Newscasting (Cloverbuds are NOT eligible to enter this category)
  One to three participants will prepare and present a news program, using
  news that occurred within the past month. It must include news, weather,
  sports and editorial; a paper manuscript is to be used. Time management and
  transitions are important. The introduction should be part of the presentation.
  No commercial advertisements are to be part of this presentation. Time Limit:
  Maximum 10 minutes.
- X. Creative Writing (Cloverbuds are NOT eligible to enter this category) Participant writes a short story, poem, skit, or other form of creative writing about any 4-H related project, activity or idea. Participants must indicate if the piece is fiction or non-fiction. The length should not exceed three pages double-spaced. Creative Writing entries are submitted to the Extension office by the entry due date and are evaluated prior to the festival and then displayed at the event.

  Members entering in creative writing are not required to attend the event.
- XI. Poster Participant creates a poster on 4-H promotion and posters are submitted to the Extension office by the entry due date. All posters must be 14" x 22" on poster board. Any medium: watercolor, ink, crayon, marker, acrylic, charcoal, or collage may be used; NOT three-dimensional or copywrited ideas. Posters are evaluated prior to the festival and then displayed at the event. Members entering posters are not required to attend the event.

Demonstration will be additional category. Members may enter in one of the above categories AND (or) Demonstration and if desired. Demonstrations will be scheduled around other categories entered so members can do all.

XII. **Demonstration** (Cloverbuds are NOT eligible to enter this category) Participants can do an individual or team demonstration. Demonstrations should be in a project area in which participants are currently enrolled. The recommended time for an individual demonstration is 5 -10 minutes and team demonstrations are 10-15 minutes. This demonstration contest is the only county one that will be held. Participants should enter demonstration on their Columbia County fair entry form to receive a premium. All demonstrators will be eligible to demonstrate at the WI State Fair in August.

This is not a judged event, however, each participant will be asked to set up their display and provide a short presentation about the discovery process used in designing and creating their project. Sample talking points that may be helpful in crafting your short presentation are listed below:

- What 4-H project area(s) does your exhibit most relate to?
- What do you already know about this project area?
- Why did you choose to focus on this project?
- What question(s) are you trying to answer? Did you answer your question(s)?
- What do you want to learn, try and/or discover about this project now?
- Who/What can help you learn more about your project?
- What resources did you use to help create your project (i.e. people, books, businesses)?
- What was the most interesting thing you discovered while creating your exhibit?
- Would you do anything differently if you recreated your project?
- What were your steps?


**Door Prize Drawing** – Portage Center for the Arts gift certificate went to Carrie Williams.
