The Waushara County 4H Horse Association is offering an exciting opportunity open to all youth grades 3rd-13th in Waushara County and surrounding counties, Join us on June 29, 2019 from 9am-4pm at the Waushara County Fairgrounds for a Youth Horsemanship Clinic with Dan Grunewald, National Judge and Clinician. We will offer two sessions and youth can participate in one or both. Registration must be completed and postmarked by June 15, 2019.

The Horse Show style session will run from 9am-12pm. This show style session, led by Dan will give youth the opportunity to practice and hone their skills in the show ring. Wisconsin Fall Forum Proposals Sought!

Have you ever wanted to share one of the great things you do in your Columbia County 4-H club? If yes, individuals and teams are encouraged to submit proposals for this year's **Fall Forum**, **November 1-3**. Proposals are due no later than **June 15** – earlier is better. This is a great opportunity for a team of county/state staff, volunteers and youth to work together and present an interactive workshop for youth and adults as well as staff from

throughout Wisconsin. Last year; over 400 youth and adult leaders plus staff attended. The committee's goal is to increase this to 500 participants (youth, adults and staff).

The committee has started to develop the workshop and interactive station schedule based on feedback from last year. We have asked statewide program teams to consider submitting proposals. And we want to invite each of you too! You have great programs – this is a place to share your great work!

There are two options for you to get involved in teaching: There will be 15 - 25 learning stations on Friday evening and over 25 different workshops offered on Saturday.

Interactive Learning Stations – Friday evening November 1st:

Time: $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours – Friday evening from 7:00 – 9:00 p.m.

Format: This is an open room concept where participants move from station to station. They may spend 5-10 minutes to 20 minutes depending how you want the learner to engage. Consider hands-on experiences that help the learner connect with the content.

Extend the Learning: We are asking this year for each station to have a handout with information about the activity or learning experience so they can use this information once they return to their county. The hope is to also have a place to upload these documents so they can also be accessed electronically.

Workshops – Saturday, November 2nd:

Time: Sessions are $1\frac{1}{2} - 2$ hours in length

Format: Hands-on experiences that help youth and adult volunteers and staff see how this could be replicated when they return to their club and county.

Extend the Learning: We are asking this year for each workshop to have a handout with the lessons that are taught so participants can use this information once they return to their county. The hope is to also have a place to upload these documents so they can also be accessed electronically.

On behalf of the planning committee for Fall Forum; we hope you will consider this an opportunity to share a great idea that is working in your county; at the state level or as a statewide team. Please consider this opportunity and submit your proposals today.
