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Columbia Co. 4-H Enrollment Deadlines:
Re-Enrolling 4-H members: November 30, 2019
New Enrolling 4-H members: March 1, 2020
Individuals who meet the above deadlines are eligible to exhibit as a 4-H member in the Junior Division at the 2020 Columbia County Fair.

#### **ENROLLMENT**

New enrollments will be taken any time of the year. The November 30 and March 1 deadlines are for determining eligibility for exhibiting as a Columbia County 4-H member in the Junior Division at the Columbia County Fair. March 1<sup>st</sup> is the deadline for adding or dropping a project. This requires contacting the Columbia County Extension Office to make the drop or add happen. Please complete the "Add or Drop Project Form" located at <a href="https://columbia.extension.wisc.edu/4-h-youth-development/4-h-forms/4-h-enrollment-forms/">https://columbia.extension.wisc.edu/4-h-youth-development/4-h-forms/4-h-enrollment-forms/</a>

Help may be needed if: you have trouble getting into or understanding enrollment on 4HOnline; you are not sure what project to enroll in; or you have an issue that may come up during the enrollment period. PLEASE DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST DAY TO ENROLL! If you have problems, help may not be available when you need it. Set yourself a deadline so that any problems can be addressed **prior to** November 30<sup>th</sup>, which would mean contacting the Columbia County Extension Office one week in advance during regular office hours (8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.). Our numbers are 608-742-9680 (office); Sarah 608-742-9685; or Pat 608-742-9685. Please do not email if you are having issues with enrollment.

#### **NEW ENROLLMENTS**

Begin with a valid email and then follow the instructions sheet - "Enrolling in 4HOnline as a NEW family." Access this from the opening page of 4honline, under "New to Wisconsin 4-H?" Adult volunteers MUST use different, valid email addresses — no duplicate emails please! You will also need to know which Columbia County 4-H Club you want to participate in.

#### **RE-ENROLLMENT**

If you were a member or adult volunteer enrolled in 4HOnline last year, all of your information will still be saved in 4HOnline. Follow the instructions sheet — "Re-enroll Members/Leaders." Access this from the opening page of 4HOnline, under "Returning Families", Please DO NOT CREATE A NEW PROFILE. Note: All past members and adult volunteers not re-enrolled by the November 30<sup>th</sup> deadline will be archived. If someone is archived and they want to return to 4-H membership, they must request that the UW-Madison Columbia County Extension Staff retrieve the record at that time.

CHANGE IN PERSONAL INFORMATION!! If your personal information changes at any time during the year, please take a moment to make the changes in 4HOnline, so that the UW-Madison Columbia County Extension office can serve you the best way possible. NOTE: We are not notified if you make changes to your 4HOnline record. Our email and mailing lists for the newsletter and the weekly update are separate from 4HOnline. Please contact the Columbia County Extension office and your Club Leader with your new information or you may miss out on some communications.

#### Changing Project Levels

Steps to change project level on 4HOnline (example: Art 1 to Art 2):

- 1. Add Art 2 as a project.
- 2. Put the same years in project down as are shown in Art 1. (Do not add a year. These years have already been advanced for the year.)
- 3. Delete Art 1. (Only project showing should be Art 2.)

#### Selecting 4-H Project Literature

4HOnline lists project literature for the entire State. However, Columbia County does NOT use that system for ordering 4-H project literature. Instead, families must refer to the 2019-2020 Columbia County 4-H Project Guide to select literature. Then, families are asked to complete the 2019-2020 Project Literature Request Form and hand it into your club leader. Both the Project Guide & the Literature Request Form are available from your club leader.

#### Youth Leadership & Project Youth Leader on 4HOnline

The Youth Leadership project is like any other project. Enroll in it if you want to learn about being a youth leader. Being a youth leader in a project is different. Qualifications: You've been in a project for 2 or more years and you're currently in 7th grade or above. You will plan and/or assist in project meetings for the 4-Her's enrolled in the project in your club or possibly county-wide. Steps to take to enroll as a youth leader in a project:

- 1. Under "Profile Information" in your 4HOnline account, make sure to check "Yes" after the question: Are you a volunteer?
- 2. Under "Participation," the *Projects* tab, in your 4HOnline account:
  - a. "Select a project": For example, if you wish to be a youth leader in Art, you will chose Art—Yth Ldr as a project.
  - b. "Select a volunteer type ... Be sure to choose "Youth Leader."
  - c. Then, Click "Add Project" to complete the addition of a "youth leader" project.

#### **General Information**

#### Parent/Guardian Behavior Expectation

Parents and guardians are expected to behave in ways that promote positive role modeling for all youth. If 4-H youth development staff have reason to believe a youth or a parent/guardian has engaged in reckless or disruptive behavior at a 4-H meeting or event sponsored by UW-Madison Division of Extension or engaged in behavior at any time that constitutes criminal child abuse or neglect, that educator will inform that youth or parent/guardian of his/her reasons for that belief and direct that individual not to attend 4-H meetings or events sponsored by UW-Madison Division of Extension. Such a youth or a parent/guardian may not attend 4-H meetings or events sponsored by UW-Madison Division of Extension until such time as the youth or parent/guardian provides reliable evidence that he/she did not engage in such conduct.

#### Age of Enrollment

4-H membership is open to all youth beginning in 5K (five-year-old Kindergarten) through one year beyond high school graduation and <u>not to extend beyond the age of 19 as of January 1st of the current enrollment year.</u>

Cloverbud Project – Youth in  $5K-2^{nd}$  grade participate in the Cloverbud project which is designed to meet the developmental needs of this age group. This does not include pre-kindergarten or four-year-old kindergarten youth. Cloverbud project members are not allowed to exhibit animals at public events nor participate in shooting sports activities.

#### All adults who will work with Columbia County 4-H Members must:

- 1. Attend a face-to-face Volunteer In Preparation training once.
- 2. Complete a Background check first year and every 4 years after. (You will receive an e-mail asking you to complete the process after you initially enroll in 4-H Online.)
- 3. Annually, signing the UW-Madison Division of Extension Volunteer Behavior Expectation document; the Assumption of Risk document; and Condistions of Service document. (Completed in 4-H Online when you enroll.)
- 4. Complete the online UW-Madison Division of Extension Volunteer Mandated Reporter Training. (You will complete this training in 4-H Online before or after the face-to-face training.)

#### Fall Forum and Hall of Fame Celebration

#### November 1-3, 2019

#### Green Lake Conference Center, Green Lake, WI

Fall Forum is an opportunity for youth and adult leaders to attend a statewide training weekend with county and state staff. It is planned by a team of youth and adult volunteers from the Wisconsin 4-H Leaders Council with the support of county and state staff.

This year at Fall Forum, a select group of 4-H volunteers, pioneers, financial supporters, and staff who made major contributions to the 4-H movement at the local, state and national levels will be inducted into the <u>Wisconsin 4-H Hall of Fame</u>. The induction ceremony will take place during dinner Saturday night.

#### The purpose of Fall Forum is to:

- Provide an educational opportunity for youth and adult volunteers
- Develop youth and adult partnerships
- Create an engaging and welcoming environment to facilitate discussion between counties and regions
- Provide an opportunity for youth and adult volunteers to be involved in the planning and evaluation of statewide programs
- Encourage diversity of thought, perspective, interests, and people
- Promote strategies for youth and adults to reach underserved and underrepresented groups.

**Who:** Youth 7th—13th grade and Adult volunteer leaders

The program kicks off Friday evening with over 20 interactive sessions. Saturday offers more than 25 workshops to choose from. Top off the night with a special celebration where laureates will be inducted in to the Wisconsin 4-H Hall of Fame. An evening of circle dancing and table games will follow the celebration. Sunday morning brings a high-energy program that you can use at the club or community level.

All youth participants are required to identify a chaperone who has completed Youth Protection training when registering. Adult volunteer delegates from a county are expected to serve as chaperones for youth delegates. Teams of adult male and female chaperones will be identified to conduct room check of youth delegates on Friday and Saturday evening. Chaperones are required to submit the Chaperone Expectation Statement.

### It's Back! Wreath making at the Miller Tree Farm November 2nd & 9th

4-H members, of any age, are invited to the Rex Miller Farm between Rio and Doylestown to make their own pine wreath and tour the farm on Saturday, November 2nd or 9th. The times are 9am, 11am, 1pm or 3pm. Parents may attend, but only youth will be completing the wreath making experience. Cost is \$5 and is non-refundable. Checks should be made payable to Rex Miller Farm and are due October 25th. Please send check to Columbia Co. Extension Office with clip-n-send on page 13.

During the approximately 2 hour experience, Mr. Miller gives the kids a tour of his farm and then, Mary Becker, 4-H Volunteer Leader, instructs participants in the making of a wreath that they can take home with them. They can add a velvet ribbon and pine cones for decoration. When the 4-H members arrive, the group is divided in half. One half will make their wreath while the other half gets a tour of the farm. About half way through, everyone switches.

(Note: Clubs are NOT to inquire about separate group tours as Mr. Miller has set these dates as his 4-H tour & wreath making dates. Thanks!)


