4-H Art Beat (Grades 3-5) Registration is Open – January 20, 2020 Registration Deadline!

Can you hear the BEAT? What BEAT? ArtBEAT! What BEAT? ArtBEAT! Even though we are in the midst of the holiday season, it IS time to start thinking about and planning to participate in our 2020 WI 4-H ArtBEAT!

4-H ArtBEAT! was created for 4-H members in grades 3-5 and their parents and leaders. It is our Wisconsin 4-H Arts and Communication introductory program at the state level. ArtBEAT! will be held March 13 through 15, 2020, at Upham Woods in Wisconsin Dells. The weekend will feature a look at a variety of arts projects including music, drama, visual arts, and more! Camp check-in begins Friday, March 13 at 6:30 pm and runs through Sunday, March 15 at 11:00 am.

4-H members will have the opportunity to explore their own creativity while discovering a variety of 4-H Arts & Communication experiences available to them now and in the near future. Session leaders will be 4-H older youth, collegiate 4-H members, 4-H adult leaders and 4-H staff members with a wealth of experience to share. Youth and adult participants will rotate through a variety of sessions, which are hands-on and active and held at various sites throughout camp. Along with exploring the "arts," participants will also have a chance to discover Upham Woods! Both youth and adult participants stay in the warm and cozy heated cabins!

Parents are not required to attend, but are invited! All adults attending the camp must be active 4-H leaders who will be considered adult advisors (chaperones) responsible for providing leadership and support for ALL campers. As such, all adults who want to attend the camp must complete the requirements to become a 4-H leader before camp and participate in an Adult Advisor Orientation Teleconference on Monday, March 2 at 7 p.m. Interested adults who are not already active 4-H volunteers should contact their **county** Extension 4-H Office as soon as possible for assistance in completing the process to become a volunteer. The process involves VIP Training and a background check.

The \$100.00 per person fee (youth and adults) will include all materials and supplies (including a very cool ArtBEAT! backpack), overnight lodging, meals and snacks.

This camp fills up fast and registration is first come, first serve! <u>Registration opened in 4H Online on</u> <u>December 20, 2019 and will close on January 20, 2020.</u> Upham Woods is able to accommodate 120 participants. Once registration is filled, participants can register to be on a WAITLIST.

4-H Archery Project Meeting Date Set—January 25th

The first 4-H archery project meeting date has been set and it will be held at Achterberg Archery/Pardee Sports Club, N6759 State Road 22, Pardeeville on Saturday, January 25th from 9 – 11 am. Youth of any skill level may attend at any time. Additional meetings are currently being scheduled and will be announced as soon as they are available. Please Note: 4-H Archery Project Meetings will be held in February, March, April, May, and June with a county wide shoot to bring the program to an end for the 4-H year.

ADD THE PROJECT: There is still time to add the 4-H Archery Project to your 4-H project list--The Shooting Sports 4-H Volunteer Team wants to encourage youth to add the 4-H Archery project by the March 1st deadline for add/drop a 4-H project as there will be many opportunities to learn more about 4-H archery and to improve youth archery skills.

Additional Archery Opportunities for Volunteer Training and Competition Announced

The State 4-H Shooting Sports committee recently announced changes to the process to become a certified Shooting Sports Volunteer. All leaders must first complete one 12-hour workshop to be certified. After that, you may be eligible to attend a Saturday, eight-hour range workshop to receive an additional discipline certification. If three years lapse before adding an additional certification, the full 12-hour certification must be repeated. Only one certification may be obtained at any one certification workshop. New for 2020 and Future Certification Workshops-- The Friday evening training has ended. A National 4-H Shooting Sports online training has replaced the Friday session. New leaders will complete this at-home training prior to attending the Saturday range training. Leaders returning for an additional certification need only register for Saturday range training. The Saturday certification workshops will remain on the same annual east/west and north/south spring rotation. Workshops for 2020 locations will be near Green Bay and Eau Claire. Workshops for 2021 will be Lodi and Phillips. Each year the fall workshop returns to Marshfield. Please check the Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports website at

WI State 4-H Livestock Quiz Bowl and 4-H Skillathon Contests – March 7, 2020

These contests will be held together at UW Madison Animal Sciences Building, Madison, WI. Deadline for registration is Feb. 21, 2020, 5 p.m. Teams are encouraged to participate in both contests as they will be occurring at the same time. Teams are divided into three age divisions and teams can consist of 3 or 4 members. The junior division are youth who are under 14 years of age as of Jan.1, 2020. The senior division are youth who are all 14 years of age or older as of Jan. 1, 2020. A mixed team must contain at least one youth from each age division.

Livestock Bowl is a quiz competition where all the questions are about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics and students use a buzzer in order to answer the questions. Teams compete in a double elimination format by giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Each match has both an individual and toss-up question round. The winning 4-H senior team will represent Wisconsin at the National 4-H Livestock Quiz Bowl competition in Louisville, KY at the North American International Livestock Exposition.

Skillathon contest is made up of a written quiz and learning stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification as well as some team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. The top Senior level 4-H team will represent Wisconsin at the National 4-H Skillathon Contest, held each fall in Louisville at the North American International Livestock Exposition.

Competition in Quiz Bowl & Skillathon encourages members to develop a more complete knowledge of animals and related subjects. This contest provides an educational program for all project members, including those who may not own a project animal, and provides a way to develop self-confidence.
