### [YQCA Flash Sale Available through April 30th](#)

Important to Note: All swine project exhibitors, Lodi Fair exhibitors, and Wisconsin State Fair exhibitors **must** complete a YQCA certification. [YQCA "flash sale" for On-line courses is running through April 30th!](#)

In light of the recent COVID-19 pandemic, the YQCA Board is announcing a 25% flash sale on the web-based certification.

Here is how to take advantage of this opportunity.

1. Only offered during the month of April (April 1 – April 30), YQCA will be offering a 25% discount on web-based trainings, making them \$9.
  - a. Those wishing to take part in the flash sale will need to purchase \$9 web-based training coupons from YQCA. Coupon order forms are attached to this message or may be obtained by emailing [sales@yqca.org](mailto:sales@yqca.org). THIS IS THE ONLY WAY TO RECEIVE THE DISCOUNTED PRICE.
  - b. Once the order form and proof of payment is received, coupons will be issued and returned to the purchaser within 3-5 business days. c. Coupons MUST be put towards a web-based training in the month of April.
2. Youth who have already paid for a YQCA instructor-led training (on a date that has not yet passed), may log into their account and cancel their registration.
  - a. If payment was received via credit card, their payment will be refunded.
  - b. If payment was received via coupon code, that coupon code will be active again. This coupon code does not expire and would be able to be used in future years.
  - c. To cancel a registered training
    - i. Go to <https://yqca.learnrow.io> and login to the account.
    - ii. Select the course - you will have an option to "Cancel Registration". This will cancel the training and refund the payment/re-activate the coupon code.

At the April 20<sup>th</sup> Columbia County Fair Board meeting, the decision was made that NO identification requirement will be enforced prior to fair. Please enter swine, sheep and meat goat animals on your fair entry form and bring them to fair with some form of ID in their ear. At fair, animals will be checked in and registered with that animal ID number. If questions, please contact the fair superintendent for the species in question or a member of the fair board. ### Cloth Face Coverings Activity Plan – Now released!

The new service learning activity plan from Wisconsin 4-H – Cloth Face Coverings – is now available for free download at <https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/home-activities/>. Many thanks to Dawn VandeVoort for creating the lesson, Melinda Pollen and Rachel Hart-Brinson for reviewing it, as well as Matt and Extension's COVID Response Team for the support in making sure we are aligned with CDC guidance! It truly was a team effort.

A few things to note in case you get questions:

- The first page is for educators with guidance about how to support it. We'd like to leave the cover page attached to the full activity plan so that the activity plan doesn't get distributed without the additional information/warnings.
- Per the CDC, we're calling them cloth face coverings, as the term "mask" is being reserved for those worn by health care professionals.
- We've done a great deal of research and worked with public health professionals to get this right and current with the CDC recommendations as of this weekend. We also encourage people to check for updates in the CDC guidance for themselves. Links are provided, both in the cover letter and on the provided, printable cards that can be attached to cloth face coverings made by youth when they donate.

*During times of disease outbreak, preventing the accidental spread of a virus protects everyone. Young people can help to prevent the spread by sewing cloth face coverings. The service learning activity plan from Wisconsin 4-H includes guidance for adults and youth in safe and supportive service learning; step-by-step instructions with photos for how to make cloth face coverings that meet CDC guidelines; as well as reflection questions and opportunities to learn even more. Youth can get involved in this important project. Educators and families can support them in doing so safely.*

1. Nomination cover page

4. Digital head and shoulder photograph and
5. Brief (no more than 250 words) biography.

Completed nominations are due by **May 20, 2020** and should be sent via email to [cynthia.blackburn@wisc.edu](mailto:cynthia.blackburn@wisc.edu). She will reply to you confirming she has received your documents as soon as possible after receiving your message, so be sure to watch for her reply in your inbox & spam in case there is a problem. *\*Please note that people who have been nominated in the past and not selected are eligible to be nominated again; however, please do not simply re-submit their first nomination, as it did not meet the criteria as described. The criteria document should be revised to increase possibility of being selected.*
