## January 2021

#### Cloverbud

#### Kitchen Science

Every time you cook in the kitchen, you use the science of chemistry to mix and heat ingredients to create things like biscuits, pretzels, fruit salad, french toast and more. ## 2021 Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Scholarship Applications Now Being Accepted

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$15,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2021. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by **Monday, March 15, 2021.** Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance, and future educational goals.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least three years; have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college, or technical school during the 2021-2022 academic school year. Scholarship winners from previous years are not eligible to receive a second 4-H Foundation scholarship.

The application is a one-page resume and a one-page cover letter, both of which give the 4-H youth a chance to share their 4-H achievements, as well as their future plans. Applicants are asked to treat this process as if applying for a job. Cover letters and resumes must be submitted as one PDF document and emailed to <a href="mailto:scholarships@wis4hfoundation.org">scholarships@wis4hfoundation.org</a>. For detailed information about what to include in and how to prepare the application documents, 4-H youth can visit www.Wis4HFoundation.org/scholarships.

A panel of experienced youth educators will screen the applications and select finalists. Applications chosen as finalists will be ranked by a second panel comprised of 4-H and youth development experts. The 4-H Foundation will assign available scholarships to the top-ranking applications based on scholarship criteria. Applicants who are awarded scholarships will be notified by postal letter and email in May.

Alyssa Frisch received a WI 4-H Foundation scholarship in 2020 to study mechanical engineering. She is a member of the New Directions 4-H Club in Columbia County.

Thea Collins received a WI 4-H Foundation scholarship in 2020 to study at Winona State. She is a member of the Lodi Challengers 4-H Club in Columbia County.

# Columbia County 4-H Self-Achievement Award Application Deadline Extended to December 15

Each year youth are eligible to apply for the 4-H Self-Achievement Award. The pandemic altered many schedules; therefore, the application deadline for this award has been extended to December 15. Guidelines for this award are listed here. Many did not complete 4-H record books for the 2019-2020 4-H year and maybe a self-achievement award would be appropriate as 4-H work did happen during the 2019-2020 4-H year, especially prior to the pandemic. If interested in earning a disc for your Columbia County 4-H plaque, please complete an appropriate application found on the Columbia County Extension 4-H website at the link below and submit to the Extension Office by December 15. ## Guidelines

- 1. 4-H members 3rd grade and older are eligible to apply for these recognition awards.
- 2. Ask your Club Leader or the Extension Office for application forms.
- 3. The deadline for application is when the record books are due at the county level. (EXTENDED)
- 4. A member is not required to have earned previous levels of recognition in order to earn any other level as long as they meet the requirements.
- 5. A member is not required to earn a recognition award every year; however, requirements for recognition must be met during the current 4-H year in which the member wants to be recognized.
- 6. Only one (1) Achievement Award may be received in any given year.
- 7. A member may receive the Clover Award one time.

## Extension Program Guidance & Approval Forms For Face-to-Face Gatherings

Whenever people are gathering in the name of 4-H, there needs to be an approved plan. 4-H members and leaders may be allowed to hold face-to-face gatherings in pods of 10 people or less and up to 50, but only if pods of 10 or less are arranged for. To accomplish this and receive approval, the following steps MUST be taken BEFORE the gathering occurs. Please request an Extension Program Guidance and Approval form from Pat Wagner and complete and return to her. Wagner will then submit the form to the workflow for approval by the UW-Madison Division of Extension 4-H Positive Youth Development Program. Once approval is received, the gathering may proceed. Following the gathering, a contact log must be submitted with names of all who were in attendance. If you have questions, feel free to contact Pat Wagner at 608-742-9685 -- pat.wagner@wisc.edu.
