The fee for the afternoon is \$14.50 per person (youth or adult). All can register whether a 4-H member, 4-H leader, parent, or sibling. Please complete the registration form at your family member list in 4honline. Once at your member list, scroll to the bottom of the page and look for the Columbia County 4-H Winter Day in the Woods event – February 21st. Complete the registration form and then mail your fee(s) to the Columbia County Extension Office, 112 E. Edgewater St., Rm. 212, Portage, WI 53901 by February 18th. Note: The fee of \$14.50 applies to both youth and adult participants. Maybe 4-H clubs want to plan their February gathering at Upham Woods. Social distancing and face coverings will be required during this event. If not a 4-H member or volunteer leader, follow these directions for registering in 4honline: When you register those non-4-H members and volunteer leaders for the Upham Woods event, use the instructions here from the state 4-H office -- follow the instructions in the How to Register For An Event Without Enrolling at https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/4h-resources/how-to-register-for-an-event/ to create their record and register for the event. Basically, they add a member to the family and when asked how they want to participate (4-H Volunteer or just want to participate without becoming a volunteer) they should choose participate without becoming a volunteer. This participation role does not trigger the background check, trainings, or choosing club/projects. It will then take them to the family member list screen and then they can register just like an enrolled member.

4-H Members and Leaders Can Add or Drop 4-H Projects in 4-H Online Now Through 3/1

The new version of 4honline has just released the option for 4-H members and leaders to add or drop 4-H project in 4-H online. This is consistent with the Columbia County 4-H policy where youth can add or drop projects until March 1. Families can edit projects by clicking **View** near the member name on the family member list screen and then clicking on **Projects**. There is now an **EDIT** button on the projects page. Clicking on EDIT will open a window similar to the add projects screen during enrollment. Then, add or drop projects. If questions, please contact the Extension Office for assistance.

One more thing -- Club leaders can download a Club Roster on their club manager screen. The roster lists all members who have started an enrollment this year with contact information. There is now a second page to the spreadsheet that lists the project selections. You can see the same roster by clicking on DOWNLOAD ROSTER on the club screen where you grant access to leaders and add projects to the club.

Cloverbud—March 2021

2021 Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Scholarship Applications Now Being Accepted

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$15,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2021. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by **Monday, March 15, 2021**. Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance, and future educational goals.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships students must have been a Wisconsin

4-H member for at least three years; have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college, or technical school during the 2021-2022 academic school year. Scholarship winners from previous years are not eligible to receive a second 4-H Foundation scholarship.

The application is a one-page resume and a one-page cover letter, both of which give the 4-H youth a chance to share their 4-H achievements, as well as their future plans. Applicants are asked to treat this process as if applying for a job. Cover letters and resumes must be submitted as one PDF document and emailed to **scholarships@wis4hfoundation.org**. For detailed information about what to include in and how to prepare the application documents, 4-H youth can visit www.Wis4HFoundation.org/scholarships. A panel of experienced youth educators will screen the applications and select finalists. Applications chosen as finalists will be ranked by a second panel comprised of 4-H and youth development experts. The 4-H Foundation will assign available scholarships to the top-ranking applications based on scholarship criteria. Applicants who are awarded scholarships will be notified by postal letter and email in May.

Extension Program Guidance & Approval Forms For Face-to-Face Gatherings

Whenever people are gathering in the name of 4-H, there needs to be an approved plan. 4-H members and leaders may be allowed to hold face-to-face gatherings in pods of 10 people or less and up to 50, but only if pods of 10 or less are arranged for. To accomplish this and receive approval, the following steps MUST be taken BEFORE the gathering occurs. Please request an Extension Program Guidance and Approval form from Pat Wagner and complete and return to her. Wagner will then submit the form to the *workflow* for approval by the UW-Madison Division of Extension 4-H Positive Youth Development Program. Once approval is received, the gathering may proceed. Following the gathering, a contact log must be submitted with names of all who were in attendance.
