Camp Counselor Training – Chance to Participate and Chance to Share Your Knowledge and Expertise

This year Upham Woods is partnering with UW—Madison Extension colleagues to offer a virtual **Camp Counselor Training Program**. This training will help both beginning counselors (as participants) and experienced counselors (as leaders) to be ready to serve as a counselor during Summer Camp 2021. This opportunity is open to all youth leaders, whether your group camps at Upham Woods or elsewhere. It is also open to adult volunteers and extension staff. Each certified Summer Camp Counselor through the Upham Woods Counselor Training Program will complete a Camp Counselor Workbook that follows asynchronous, pre-recorded training videos based on training topics. Counselors will connect with each other, discuss the topics, and ask questions during one of the synchronous, discussion sessions on March 27 or April 17, 2021. *Virtual attendance at one of these sessions is required for all counselors.* The workbook should be finished before counselors-in-training attend a synchronous training session.

Upham Woods is also seeking experienced camp counselors and camp staff input and expertise on any summer camp topic. Please consider submitting a training video or attending any of our synchronous sessions as a leader to answer questions and/or facilitate discussion. [4-H Members Can Add or Drop 4-H Projects in 4-H Online Now Through 3/1](#)

The new version of 4honline has just released the option for 4-H members to add or drop 4-H projects in 4-H online. This is consistent with the Columbia County 4-H policy where youth can add or drop projects until March 1. Families can edit projects by clicking **View** near the member name on the family member list screen and then clicking on **Projects**. There is now an **EDIT** button on the projects page. Clicking on EDIT will open a window similar to the add projects screen during enrollment. Then, add or drop projects. If questions, please contact the Extension Office for assistance.

The Columbia County 4-H Leaders Association, Inc. is offering a maximum of ten (10) \$300 scholarships. These scholarships will be divided between graduating high school seniors currently enrolled in 4-H and 4-H alumni. A maximum of two (2) male and two (2) female applicants may be eligible for the \$500.00 Comstock scholarships, which are given instead of the Columbia County 4-H Leaders Association scholarship. 2021 Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Scholarship Applications Now Being Accepted

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$15,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2021. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by **Monday, March 15, 2021.**

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance, and future educational goals.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least three years; have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college, or technical school during the 2021-2022 academic school year. Scholarship winners from previous years are not eligible to receive a second 4-H Foundation scholarship.

The application is a one-page resume and a one-page cover letter, both of which give the 4-H youth a chance to share their 4-H achievements, as well as their future plans. Applicants are asked to treat this process as if applying for a job. Cover letters and resumes must be submitted as one PDF document and emailed to scholarships@wis4hfoundation.org. For detailed information about what to include in and how to prepare the application documents, 4-H youth can visit www.Wis4HFoundation.org/scholarships.

A panel of experienced youth educators will screen the applications and select finalists. Applications chosen as finalists will be ranked by a second panel comprised of 4-H and youth development experts. The 4-H Foundation will assign available scholarships to the top-ranking applications based on scholarship criteria. Applicants who are awarded scholarships will be notified by postal letter and email in May.

[Extension Program Guidance & Approval Forms For Face-to-Face Gatherings](#)

Whenever people are gathering in the name of 4-H, there needs to be an approved plan. 4-H members and leaders may be allowed to hold face-to-face gatherings in pods of 10 people or less and up to 50, but only if pods of 10 or less are arranged for. To accomplish this and receive approval, the following steps MUST be taken BEFORE the gathering occurs. Please request an Extension Program Guidance and Approval form from Pat Wagner and complete and return to her. Wagner will then submit the form to the *workflow* for approval by the UW-Madison Division of Extension 4-H Positive Youth Development Program. Once approval is received, the gathering may proceed. Following the gathering, a contact log must be submitted with names of all who were in attendance. If you have questions, feel free to contact Pat Wagner at 608-742-9685 pat.wagner@wisc.edu.
