2021 Columbia Co. Fair – July 18-25 –Will Go On In-Person

The Columbia County Fair Board met earlier this week, reviewed the results of the fair survey, and voted to plan for an in-person fair. The theme will be "A Fair To Remember." Youth and adults should plan for the opportunity to exhibit their animal and non-animal projects in much the same way as they have in the past. There will be some COVID guidance required. Details will be shared as soon as they are available and will be released here, in the 4-H Weekly Update, and on the Columbia County Fair—Portage, WI 53901 Facebook page. An update will also be shared at the 4-H Leaders Council meeting tomorrow night! The Columbia County Fair website is currently under construction. Questions can be directed to any fair board member as well.

NOTE: The 2020 fair premium list will be used for the 2021 Columbia County Fair. Paper copies are available at the Extension Office today.

Columbia Co. Livestock Committee and Columbia Co. Fair Board to Plan Auction

On April 20th, the Youth Livestock Committee met and heard updates from Paul Becker of the Columbia County Fair Board. With the decision by the fair board to move forward with an in-person fair, the livestock committee was informed that livestock shows and a livestock auction will happen during the 2021 Columbia County Fair. No pre-fair ID will be required for swine, sheep, and goats. ID will be requested on the fair entry forms so all animals must have a form of identification.

The Livestock Committee will meet again, in-person, at the Columbia County Fairgrounds on May 25 at 7 p.m. to review details and finish preparing for the livestock shows and auction. All interested are encouraged to attend.

Wisconsin State Fair Changing Fair Entry Process for Youth Expo in 2021

Wisconsin State Fair will continue to display projects in the Youth Expo Building at State Fair Park, but differently. State Fair has opened up opportunities for all Wisconsin youth, 12 and older, to self-nominate their projects in the Youth EXPO building. Projects will no longer be selected at the county fair in July and then displayed at the State Fair the same year in August. Get Involved in the Plarn Mats 2021 Service Learning Project

Did you know about one trillion single-use plastic bags are used every day in the U.S? That's according to EarthDay.org. And many in our community are experiencing homelessness. We've created a service project to reuse plastic bags and to help the community. It's the 2nd Annual Wisconsin 4-H Service Learning Project.



Youth can take part in the Plarn Mats project. Plarn is plastic yarn, made by looping plastic bags. The plarn is then crocheted together to create a mat. The mat can be used to lie on or to help with warmth.

4-H Rules for Gathering / Meeting Are Changing Beginning April 1

Program Guidance Update from the Wisconsin 4-H Program and Positive Youth Development Institute:

- Events held April 1 June 1 have new guidance
- Read and talk with your county 4-H Extension professional if you have any questions.
- Continue to submit Extension Program Guidance and Approval checklist with support of Extension staff
- Read the updated FAQs with changes effective April 1st. You can find the FAQs at https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/4-h-faqs-related-to-covid-19/

What is changing April 1?

- 1. Number of people who can be at events or programs is increasing
 - 30% of room capacity with a maximum of 50 people allowed indoors
 - 150 people allowed for outdoor programming
- 2. Pod Size increasing to 20
 - Groups of 20 or fewer can meet together.
 - o For example, a club or committee with 20 or fewer people
 - If you have 21 or more people you will need to break into groups.
 - For example, 34 people at a workshop could meet in a group of 17 and 17 OR any combination that is less than 20 per group.
- 3. Maximum length of indoor events increasing to 4 hours

What continues after April 1?

- Continued Use of Face Coverings
- No Eating Indoors
- Physical Distancing (6 ft between members outside household; 20 ft between pods)
- Hand sanitizing/disinfecting requirements
- When there is more restrictive local guidance we must follow that rather than our guidance.

Extension Program Guidance & Approval Forms For Face-to-Face Gatherings

Whenever people are gathering in the name of 4-H, there needs to be an approved plan. Please request an Extension Program Guidance and Approval form from the Extension Office or find it on the Columbia County Extension website under 4-H Forms. Then, complete the form and return it to Pat Wagner, who will then submit the form to the *workflow* for approval by the UW-Madison Division of Extension 4-H Positive Youth Development Program. Once approval is received, the gathering may proceed. Following the gathering, a contact log must be submitted with names of all who were in attendance. • Sewing and Textiles—June 2021

Using the 4-H STEAM Clothing series from University of Nebraska at Lincoln, we will explore some basics of sewing. Projects will be introductory sewing and will require users of this Explore 4-H Project kit to use their own sewing machine. The "Let's Sew!--A Beginner's Sewing Guide" by Nancy Zieman will also be referenced. There will also be a Halloween textiles project that will not require the use of a sewing machine, but rather will use skills for following instructions and using tools to cut and create with deco mesh.

Cloverbuds—June 2021

Here comes SUMMER - let's get outside and EXPLORE! The June Cloverbud Explore kit will be full of activities to explore nature. You will go on a scavenger hunt for signs of wildlife, learn to identify different types of birds and plants, collect objects from nature, learn how seeds travel, and create some fun nature inspired art pieces.

Animal Science—June 2021

Using the Veterinary Science Project curriculum, we will explore what you need for animals. From their basic needs, to body language and some areas in between.
