### **MINING: ESSENTIAL TO A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE (course description)**

This virtual, eight-session evening program, for youth grades 5-8, introduces participants to mining, one of Wisconsin's most important industries, through a series of activities that show how every-day aspects of the students' lives are dependent on minerals and the career paths that provide them. Students will gain inter-disciplinary knowledge as well as enhanced STEAM exposure through guided instruction and experiential learning modes facilitated by industry professionals and project helpers. The curriculum is designed to recognize the impacts of mining from a social, cultural, and environmental perspective – but also show the students how to attain careers in these various professions that support the mining industry. A workbook and course materials will be provided at no cost to the participant.

Begins Wednesday, January 12, 2022 from 6:30-7:30PM via Zoom and runs on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month through April 20.

### **Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Kicks Off Art Contest**

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation has kicked off a contest that challenges all 4-H members to explore their creativity. It is called, the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Celebrates the Arts Art Contest and it is open to any current Wisconsin 4-H member, with cash prizes totaling nearly \$1,000. The contest will be held virtually, with photos of all entries submitted electronically. Entries are being accepted now through December 31, 2021.

The contest is broken into eight categories:

1. Drawing Using Any Medium
2. Painting (acrylic, watercolor or oil)
3. Pottery, Ceramics or Clay
4. Photography
5. Paper
6. Fabric, Yarn or Fiber
7. Wood
8. Any Other Media (ex: digital, metalcraft, jewelry, leatherwork, wax, eggshells, taxidermy, etc.)

A winner will be chosen in each category with a Best of Show award given to one entry chosen by the judging committee. Category winners will receive a \$100 cash award. The Best of Show entry will receive an additional \$150 cash award. Other art may be recognized but will not receive a cash award. Winners will be notified by email by February 1. A complete winner's list, as well as photos of the winning entries, will be on the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Website by February 15, 2022.

To be eligible for the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Art Contest, youth must be a 4-H member enrolled in 4H Online for the 2021-2022 4-H Program Year. Entrants do not need to be enrolled in any specific project to participate.

- **Entries will be accepted from October 1, 2021, until 11:59 p.m. on December 31, 2021.**

- A tip sheet for entrants is available. Please review this information to learn how best to present and share your art.
- Each artist may submit one entry in one or more category but may submit only one entry in any one category. Example: Fred can submit a photo, a chalk drawing and a ceramic dish, but he cannot enter two photos.

The Foundation will sell the art in an art auction to be held in the spring of 2022. Proceeds from the Celebrate the Arts auction will be split with half invested in the Talen Endowment for 4-H Arts Programming for future program needs and half used for arts programming in the next 4-H program year.

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$15,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2022. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by **Tuesday, March 15, 2022, 5:00 pm**.

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance and future educational goals.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least three years; should have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2022-2023

academic school year. Scholarship winners from previous years are not eligible to receive a second 4-H Foundation scholarship.

*All applications must adhere to the conventions outlined on the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation website at <https://wis4hfoundation.org/scholarships/>. Any application that does not meet these requirements will not be considered. All documents must be emailed to the 4-H Foundation as one, two-page PDF. Any other cloud/internet shared documents will be NOT be accepted (do NOT use Google Docs, for example).*

The application materials represent what youth may be asked to submit when applying for jobs. We encourage applicants to treat this process as if applying for a position.

*\*For help with creating cover letters and résumés, applicants should reach out to their club leaders, county educator or a teacher or parent.*

### **Columbia County 4-H Scholarships--**

The Columbia County 4-H Leaders Association, Inc. is offering a maximum of ten (10) \$300 scholarships. These scholarships will be divided between graduating high school seniors currently enrolled in 4-H and 4-H alumni. A maximum of two (2) male and two (2) female applicants may be eligible for the \$500.00 Comstock scholarship, which is given instead of the Columbia County 4-H Leaders Association scholarship.

**Requirements:** Applicants for this 4-H scholarship must meet the following eligibility requirements:

1. Have five (5) or more years of active membership in the Columbia County 4-H program (*excluding years as a Cloverbud*).
2. The maximum age, as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, is 25 years old.
3. Be re-enrolled in a post high school educational institution and have successfully completed at least one semester of 12 or more credits/full time status (*2.0 or better on a 4.0 scale*).
4. Plan to continue in a post high school educational institution during the coming year. Submit a copy of your college/technical school's transcript or grades (need not be official) no later than **March 15th**.
5. Submit a completed scholarship application to Extension -- Columbia County, no later than **March 15<sup>th</sup>**.
6. Applicant must receive a 70% or higher evaluation score to receive a 4-H scholarship.
7. Scholarship money will be sent when a copy of confirmation of registration for that coming year and proof of payment for at least the first installment of fall registration is received by Leaders Council.

Applicants may reapply for this scholarship in future years if he/she has been an active member for seven (7) or more years and will continue a post high school education. An applicant may not receive a Columbia County 4-H Scholarship more than two (2) times total.

The Columbia County Livestock Committee is offering "Sale of Champion Scholarships. The number and amount of the scholarships will be determined by the Livestock Scholarship Committee.

**Deadline: March 15<sup>th</sup>.**

**Requirements:**



1. Exhibitor of a meat animal project at the Columbia County Fair who has sold in the Sale of Champions at least once.
2. Current enrollment in 4-H, FFA, or other youth organization approved by the Columbia County Fair Board for participation in junior fair exhibits.
3. Current or previous year high school graduate.
4. Enrolled in post-high school educational institution. *(Current year high school graduates will receive scholarship funds once their first semester of 12 or more credits/full time status is completed and their first semester transcripts [with a 2.0 or better GPA on a 4.0 scale] plus proof of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester enrollment have been submitted to the Extension--Columbia County Office. Previous year graduates, who have completed one year of post-secondary education, will receive scholarship funds when their Spring semester of 12 or more credits/full time status is completed and their Spring semester transcripts [with a 2.0 or better GPA on a 4.0 scale] plus proof of Fall semester enrollment is submitted to the Extension--Columbia County Office.)*
5. Applicants may receive this scholarship only one time.
6. Application is signed and reviewed by a 4-H leader, FFA advisor, or other approved youth organization sponsor who is not related to the applicant.
7. Submit completed scholarship application to the Extension--Columbia County Office, 4-H Positive Youth Development Educator, 112 E. Edgewater Street, Room 212, Portage, WI 53901 by **March 15<sup>th</sup>**, current year.

2. Registration is only available through 4-H Online at “Events”.
3. Certification workshop fees are paid by credit card through 4-H Online when registering.
4. If a county is paying registration fees for their leaders, contact Doug Thompson or Justin Lieck for arrangements.
5. Complete the online National 4-H Shooting Sports training – this is a \$21 credit card fee separate from the certification workshop fee and paid at time of online training. (See the link above for training details.)
6. Online National 4-H Shooting Sports training can be completed prior to achieving county 4-H leader status.
